

 - o They **oppress** the needy of the world.
 - o They <u>disregard</u> the justice of their God.
- The God of the weak...
 - o He sees their **need**.
 - o He hears their cry.
 - He brings them **hope**.
 - Justice will reign.
 - **Deliverance** will come.

Implications of this Psalm...

- The cross is the solution to **our** crisis.
 - We are <u>wicked</u>.
 - We are weak.
 - o At the cross...
 - God judges our sins.
 - God makes us His sons.
- The cross is the solution to the **orphan** crisis.
 - o In light of our wickedness...
 - We must recognize that we are not <u>rescuers</u>.
 - We must realize that we are the **rescued**.
 - o In light of our weakness...
 - We now see their need.
 - We now **hear** their cries.
 - We now **bring** them hope.
 - As **families**...
 - As a **faith family**...
